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Traveling to Foreign Countries:

Requirements for travel vary greatly between all foreign countries. If your pet is traveling to a foreign country we will help with the research process and try our best to make sure that your pet has met all necessary requirements before leaving the United States. Many foreign countries have such strict processes and requirements for importing or traveling with pets that it is highly recommended to use a Pet Relocation service when moving or traveling to a foreign country. If you wish, we can provide you with information on popular companies that provide this service. If we make this recommendation and you choose not to use a relocation service, we will require that you sign a release of liability before we continue with the process to help prepare your pet for travel. Our office manager will be in contact with you very soon to discuss the requirements for travel to your destination.

Traveling to Hawaii:

You will need to visit Hawaii's travel website to learn more about the different travel options and requirements but the following list covers the basic requirements for traveling or moving to Hawaii. Their website is:

- Microchip identification is required (before Rabies Titer testing)
- Must have been given at least 2 rabies vaccinations (no less than 30 days apart)
- Rabies Titer Testing (can be done 21 days or more after the last rabies vaccination)
Once the sample is received by the lab the quarantine period begins.
- Mandatory 30 day quarantine period in contiguous 48 states. The quarantine period is simply a waiting period of 30 days before the pet can travel into Hawaii. This must be completed for the direct airport release and the 5 day or less programs. If you choose to travel before the 30 days have passed, the remaining days will have to be spent in a quarantine facility in Hawaii at the owner's expense.
- Import form and payment must be received by HDOA more than 30 days before arrival
- Appointment must be made with an approved Hawaii veterinary facility to do the arrival health check and airport release.
- All other vaccinations must also be up to date. Required vaccinations are as follows;
For Dogs: Distemper-Parvo, Leptospirosis, and Bordetella
For Cats: RCP-C and Feline Leukemia
- Within 10 days of travel (no more than 10 days!) you will need to make an appointment with our office for an exam, health certificate and application of Frontline Gold.
